- During 2000-2012 several inspection reports identified serious problems in recordkeeping at a nuclear power station.
- Several generations of electronic records systems/
 paper-based records created a complex situation.
- No appraisal was undertaken everything was kept.

- January 2016: Fatal server crash.
- Members lost photos, messages, status updates.
- Organisations lost contact with customers.





2016 - Facebook G+ crash



- A big hole in worldwide documentation of everyday social life.
- Irreparable personal loss.
- Economic loss for organisations & companies due to lost member & customer connections.




2016 - Facebook G+ crash

- Nothing was appraised everything destroyed.
- An archivist in the organisation could have changed this by *educating* and *reaching out*:
 - 1. Tools and standards for organisations.
 - 2. Making individuals aware of the importance of appraising their personal e-records (throughout the digital universe).

- 2026 The Swiss Revolution enacted via Chipper®™.







Chipper^{®™}: Social Media & Digital Archaeology




- □ Chipper®™ records collected by the Chinese National Archives (CNA) & transferred to secure storage servers.
- CNA appraisal policy in conflict with the Swiss users' values – 'valuable' records destroyed!
- Archivists now working to recover data through digital brain archaeology: custody is pointless & our expertise is essential.




















